

Career Development Studio associated with the 24th Workshop on Long Term Complications of HIV and SARS COV2

***Are you a trainee engaged in HIV Comorbidity research or research on long COVID?
Do you want to get feedback on specific aims of research project in development?
Do you want to get feedback on research in progress?***

Come join the Career Development Studio!

What it is: This will be a highly interactive event where early stage investigators (ESIs) from around the world engaged in HIV Comorbidity research or PASC research can get feedback on their research projects from leaders in the field.

When will it be: Monday, 12 December at 7am PST, 10am EST, 4pm CET and will last ~120 minutes via online platform.

Who can apply: Any ESI engaged in HIV Comorbidity/PASC Research who is developing or has an ongoing research project in the field. ESI is defined as an investigator who is within 10 years of either a terminal research degree or medical residency or equivalent. It is not necessary to have submitted an abstract to the 2022 Workshop to be eligible. ESIs who do present their research as a poster or oral abstract at the 2022 workshop can present the same project at the studio to get more feedback.

What is needed to apply:

- Most recent curriculum vita
- Letter of recommendation from mentor
- Specific Aims of Research Project
- Designation of whether the project is: 1) In development (new idea), 2) Ongoing, without results, 3) Ongoing, with results (either preliminary or final)

These should be submitted by Wednesday 26 October at 23H (11PM) CET to comorbidities@intmedpress.com.

Approximately 12 ESIs will be accepted to present.

What will happen during the studio: Each ESI will be given 15 – 20 minutes to present their project, after which there will be 20-30 minutes of discussion with the studio moderators and the other ESIs. Two – three ESIs will present during the session and ~4 sessions will occur concurrently. The content of the presentation and discussion will be kept confidential to encourage open discussion. More specific guidelines about the suggested content of the presentations will be given closer to the event.



Why you should want to participate: This is going to be a superb opportunity to get feedback on your work and network in a small group setting with leaders in the field as well as junior colleagues from around the world.
